Enrichment Activity


In enrichment this week, Mrs Storey and the enrichment group made delicious flapjack, drizzled with yummy chocolate.

EYFS



We practiced this and then looked at how we could help someone who was ill or injured. We also looked at how we could help someone who was choking, bleeding or not breathing. It was great fun practicing bandaging and CPR but realize how important these skills are and how they could save a life.

We have also been learning about keeping safe at this time of year with the dark nights, Halloween, and bonfire night. We were given some reflective items to put on our coats or bags to help us be seen when out in the dark. A lady came to talk to use about road safety and we had opportunities to practice crossing the road using zebra and pelican crossings.

On Friday 21st October we had a Halloween day in school with a Halloween café and pupils and staff had the opportunity to dress up. We also made some Halloween decorations and decorated our classroom. We also had a Halloween themed maths lesson where we measured sticks for broomsticks and measured out liquids for potions.
